For courses sponsored by the Palos Verdes Amateur Radio Club, students thru grade 12 who pass their examination at a PVARC VE test session will, upon application to the Club, be eligible for reimbursement up to a maximum of \$50 to cover the cost of materials and the examination fee.

Everyone who obtains their first ham radio license through a PVARC VE session, regardless of age, will receive a free membership in the Palos Verdes Amateur Radio Club for the remainder of the current calendar year.

URAC's VE Corner ... Gary N6HMR

<u>Paperless licenses</u> ... to print an official copy of your Amateur license, log into the ULS (Universal Licensing System) with your FRN and password.

Not sure what your FRN is? Look on your license, or go to <u>http://wireless2.fcc.gov/UlsApp/UlsSearch/searchLicense.jsp</u> and enter your callsign. You'll find your FRN displayed.

Don't have a password? Go to <u>http://wireless.fcc.gov/uls/index.htm?job=home</u>; under "ONLINE FILING" select "Forgot Password."

Once you have your FRN and Password, go to <u>https://wireless2.fcc.gov/UlsEntry/licManager/login.jsp</u> and Log In. In the yellow banner to the left, select the third option "Download Electronic Authorizations." In the "My Authorizations" box, highlight your amateur license, select the "ADD" button to move it to Authorizations to Download," then select the "Download" prompt at lower right. This will download your license, with "Official Copy" across it. (Accessing your license from the original license search gives the same document with "Reference Copy" across it.)

In April we had successful MROP and Amateur Tech, General and Extra examinees; also one Tech upgraded to General based on credit for having a Technician Class license prior to 1987. As a reminder, the General Class question pool change is effective July 1st. If you're ready (or about ready) for an exam, please let club president Bill W6AJ or myself know and we'll put an exam team together for you.

Many thanks to our VEs and CEs for your participation. Without the volunteer help, these exams would not be possible. And our continued thanks to Marifrances for making the Brass Room available; a very quiet, comfortable environment for testing.


