

The November meeting of the United Radio Amateur Club will be held Friday, November 17<sup>th</sup>, at 7 pm in the break room of the Los Angeles Maritime Museum, located at Berth 84, foot of Sixth Street in San Pedro. Please see the current parking situation from the Maritime Museum, below. The entrance to the break room is through the gate on the north side of the museum (towards the bridge and the lowa). There will be a greeter on the gate.

## Program:

The presentation is on direct sampling software defined radios, theory and practice. The "hottest" (in popularity, not thermally) HF transceiver now on the market is Icom's IC-7300. Presenting will be PVARC members Ray Day, N6HE, and Clay Davis, AB9A, who both own this radio. Ray brought his IC-7300 to Two Harbors on Catalina Island for our recent IOTA DXpedition and his IC-7300 was heavily used. Even during our non-stop participation in the North American RTTY QSO Party the IC-7300 never got warm to the touch. Ray and Clay

will also discuss some new developments in SDR radios announced at the Dayton Hamvention.

Clay, AB9A, lists the following: First Licensed in 2010. Extra Class License in 2011. Interested in DX and DMR. DXCC both Phone and CW. Interested in SDR Radio technology. Own a Flex 3000



and iCom 7300. Retired as VP Engineering of an international entertainment company where he Commissioned, installed and operated large scale (100 channel) DSP systems. Member of the Southern California DX Club and the Palos Verdes Amateur Radio Club

Ray, N6HE was first Licensed in 1962. Ray has been a URAC member continuously since 1975, was Sec'y and Pres a couple or 3 times each...been at every K6AA FD that I was in the country for since then, and participated in the many circuit-board convention give-aways we did and headed up the IARU Project Goodwill effort (from which he's still recovering!), and is active on: DXCC: CW, SSB, RTTY, About 20 different flavors of WAS (incl'g) 5BWAS and WAS with the IARU Project Goodwill receiver (that was work!). Los Angeles Maritime Museum Visitor Access- Parking Update: October 2017



<u>Due to the Harbor Boulevard Realignment project</u>, access to Sampson Way (the road parallel to the Museum) is now restricted.

**Driving Directions from the 110 South Freeway:** Take the Harbor Boulevard exit. At the bottom of the ramp, bear right, get in the left lane, and continue one mile to the intersection of Harbor and 6th Streets. Bear left at the 6th Street traffic light, and make an immediate right onto Sampson Way. You will see white concrete barriers marking the end of Sampson Way. The entry to the parking lot will be on the left, directly in front of the barriers. Parking is free!

**Directions coming from the West:** Head east on 22nd Street and bear left onto Miner Street, which becomes Harbor Boulevard. When the road splits, keep left. Take a right at the intersection of Harbor and 6th Streets, and follow the parking directions above. Vehicles will no longer be able to access Sampson Way by driving through Ports O'Call village. Pedestrians will still have access.

Parking for visitors with disabilities remains available across the street from the Museum entrance.

Please note: the Museum will be open regular hours, Tuesday - Sunday 10-5, throughout the construction project.


were chock full of possibilities.

I spent many hours poring over the Allied and Lafayette catalogs as a kid.

These two are from 1968, when I was 13 years old.

So, you can imagine how I felt when, last Thursday, I found both the Autumn/Winter 2017 DX Engineering catalog and the 2018-2019 Newark

Electronics/element14 catalog in my mailbox.





DX Engineering has really taken the amateur radio world by storm over the last ten years or so. I probably don't have to tell you about that. If you're an active amateur radio operator, I'm sure that you have heard about—and probably ordered from—DX Engineering.

I think that DX Engineering did a very smart thing by investing the money in a print catalog. There's something about browsing a print catalog that is just more satisfying than browsing online.


DX Engineering has just about everything you need to have fun with amateur radio. The one glaring omission? They still don't carry my study guides!



The Newark/element14 2018-2019 catalog is a completely different beast. Amateur radio operators are only a small part of Newark/element14's market, but one nonetheless. They have, for example, attended the Dayton Hamvention for many years.

As such, the catalog is not a "ham radio" catalog, but if you build stuff at all you'll find something of interest in its 1,799 pages. It includes nearly any kind of electronic part that you might need.

The section that might you might want to start with is the "makerspace" section. In this section, you'll find Raspberry Pis,



BeagleBones, and even micro:bits. They really have everything, though, including passive and active components, connectors, cable, and enclosures.

Like I say, these catalogs are all about possibilities. You can search each company's website and find the parts they carry quickly and easily, but that experience is just not the same as browsing a print catalog and daydreaming about what you might find there.

So, get your own copies—they're free—and page through them. I'd be surprised if you didn't run across something that you didn't know about before, and it gave you some ideas about your next amateur radio project.
