everyone bring a good flashlight, closed toed shoes for all, and ladies wear pants.


If anyone has a problem w/ stairs we can walk

J. Kipling Louttit, Captain, U.S. Coast Guard, Retired

Captain Kip Louttit leads a staff of 20 civilians and a Coast Guard detail of six active duty Operations Specialists with an annual budget of \$2.8 million. The Marine Exchange of Southern California, a non-profit

Notes: (1) We are a tenant of Angel's Gate Park, near the Korean Bell.

- (2) If you plug the physical address into your GPS, depending on the brand, you get to the entrance of the park or somewhere in the park but not necessarily to the MX. Therefore, GPS users start at step 4 below.
- Make your way to Gaffey Street in San Pedro. This can be from the 110 freeway, the Vincent Thomas Bridge, or PV Drive South/25th Street.
- 2. Proceed South on Gaffey Street. The street numbers will get bigger.
- *At 25th street, there is an "S" turn. The left lane continues on Gaffey Street, which is what you want. The right lane goes up the hill to 25th street, which you don't want.
- At the light at 32nd street, make a right at the light to enter Angels Gate Park.
- 5. Go up the steep hill and the road bends around to the left.
- 6. You will pass a large grass field on your left that is fenced.
- At the end of the large grass field there is a small, horizontal, wood sign that says "Marine Exchange." If you start downhill, you just missed it.
- 8. Make a left and go through the white swing gate.
- Go straight until you reach the little traffic circle, take the fork to the right, drive to the end, and see our building. Park anywhere.
- 10. Go to the door with the glass enclosure and ring the buzzer on the right



side of the door. The VTS watch will buzz you in.

Novice Day - Every Friday 0000z to 2400z is now Novice Day on 7114 Khz. No contest, just a day set aside for the beginners, the slower ops or anyone that wants help. The goal is to congregate our beginners and they can help each other. Also to increase activity on 40 meters above 7100 KHz.

Need help with Code Practice at home, in the car, or at the office during your breaks? John KF7BYU, SKCC #6666 has helped create a new web page with practice CW MP3 files. Each audio file has a matching text file that you can read along, if you like. Some are full length books and start out slow and increase CW speed by 1 word per minute for each new chapter. Take a look to the right hand side, and you will find SKCC members logged on.

If your browser is working correctly, then you will see where others might be operating. You can also post where you are listening or calling CQ or just ask a question, maybe send a greeting. There are many SKCC members found there, they are eager to bring new and old CW operators into the group and if you ask for a slow speed contact, you will get several offers. You can see the calls of those logged in at current time on the screen. Sometimes the logged in stations are not actually looking at the computer screen, so do not be discouraged if you don't get a reply instantly. If you are looking for a specific station, include that stations call sign or the operators name in your message. It will then appear in a highlighted color on that operators screen to alert them.

The Sked Page is a great place to schedule a contact, whatever your purpose. A great thing about it is if the schedule does not work out, you can find out why on line when the other station comes back and tells you if he could not hear you, the frequency was busy, or maybe there was QSB. It is also great place for folks to get started on their SKCC QSO's, to work on awards, or just start a new friendship.


