The teaching team brings emergency communications experience from the Red Cross, ARES, and Los Angeles County Disaster Communications Service (DCS). They offer real-life context to textbook study with lectures and PowerPoints over four Wednesday evenings from 7 to 9 pm. Once you get your license, trainers will help you get started using your first radio to help your community.

Get the basics FIRST by reading the "Fast Track" textbook. (right) Book chapters are also available as convenient podcasts. Online practice exams target questions from the actual FCC exam to help you know when you are ready to pass. Gordon West's "Technician Study Guide 2022-2026" is an alternate textbook.





After the workshop, when you feel ready to take the official FCC exam, guidance to American Radio Relay League (ARRL)-certified online testing is available. FCC license testing is done separately from the class.

For instance, FCC-approved testing is available through certified testers at https://hamstudy.org/sessions/lagroup/remote They also offer information and learning tools.

Official FCC exams are \$10, and the FCC charges \$35 for the license application itself. The applicant gets an invoice from the FCC after testing results are filed by the official "VEC" (tester) and students have 10 calendar days to pay online. Online exams are arranged by the applicant through PayPal and can be paid by credit card or PayPal account through the PayPal payment gateway. (Exam are free to students under 18 and military personnel, active or retired.)

FCC <u>"Technician"</u> course (entry level)
FCC <u>"General"</u> course (2nd level)

The sessions will be on 4 and 11 February 2023

Technician 9:30 AM to 1:15 PM both Saturdays (bring your lunch)

General 1:30 PM to 5:00 PM both Saturdays

The FCC tests will be 10:00 AM to noon on 18 February 2023

At the start of the 4 February Technician course, a member of the Palos Verdes Amateur Radio Club will give a 30-minute presentation on how to get further involved in amateur radio.

I charge no fee for either course. Taking the FCC test is \$15. After passing the Technician test the FCC will send you an e-mail for paying its \$35 license fee and then they will post your call sign.

Optional Material (sold at cost)

Gordon West books with all the FCC test questions, \$30 for the Technician and \$26 for the General Paper copy of Walt's Power Point charts, \$28 for the Technician and \$24 for the General

For courses sponsored by the Palos Verdes Amateur Radio Club, students thru grade 12 who pass their examination at a PVARC VE test session will, upon application to the Club, be eligible for reimbursement up to a maximum of \$50 to cover the cost of materials and the examination fee.

Everyone who obtains their first ham radio license through a PVARC VE test session, regardless of age, will receive a free membership in the Palos Verdes Amateur Radio Club for the remainder of the current calendar year.
